

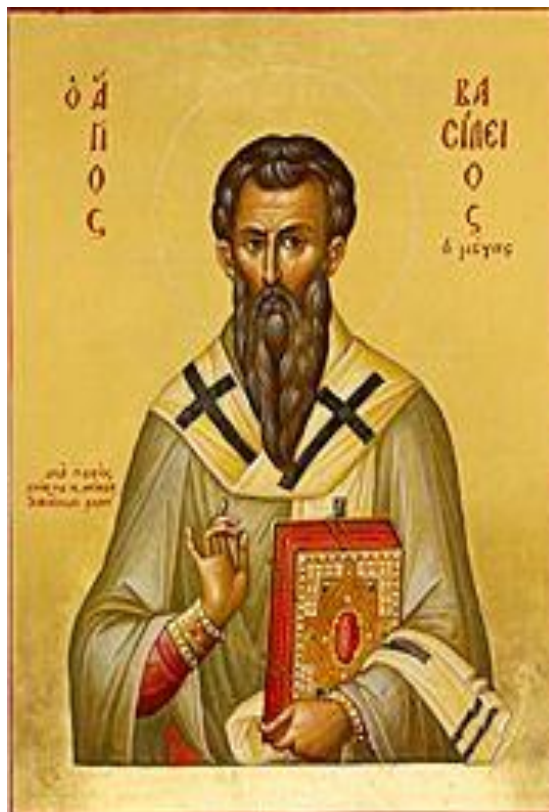

#### **Apolytikion for St. Raphael in the Fourth Tone**

*Because of the finding of your holy relics,  
wise one, \* the Island of Lesvos has been filled  
fully with the grace, \* which God richly gave to  
you. \* You, O devout martyr Raphael,  
paradoxically \* appeared to many people, and  
you grant cures and healings. \* And therefore  
we the faithful re-joyce in all your miracles.*

#### **Apolytikion for St. Raphael in the First Tone**

*To the offspring of Ithaca, the pride and joy  
of Lesvos, \* monastic martyrs' glory, let us offer  
to Raphael our songs of praise; \* for lately he  
appeared, and pours out cures and healings to  
us all. \* Inexplicably he appears to believers,  
both in dreams and awake, who cry: \* Glory to  
Christ who gave you His might. \* Glory to Him  
who gave you miracles. \* Glory to Him who  
through you fulfills our prayerful requests.*

#### **Apolytikion in honor of Sts. Raphael, Nicholas & Irene**

*Having contended on Lesvos for the sake of  
Christ God, you have sanctified the island since  
the discovery of your sacred relics, O blessed  
ones; wherefore we honor you, O Godbearing  
Raphael, together with Nicholas and virgin  
Irene, as our divine protectors and intercessors  
with the Lord.*

#### **Resurrectional Apolytikion in the Third Tone**

Let the heavens sing for joy, and let everything on earth be glad. For with His Arm the Lord has worked power. He trampled death under foot by means of death; and He became the firstborn from the dead. From the maw of Hades He delivered us; and He granted the world His great mercy.

#### **Apolytikion of the Feast in the First Tone**

In essence being God, most-compassionate Master, \* You assumed human nature without transmutation. \* Fulfilling the Law, of Your own will \* You accepted circumcision in the flesh, \* to bring an end to the shadow, and to remove the passions that cover us. \* Glory to Your benevolence, O Lord; \* glory to Your compassion; \* glory to Your inexpressible condescension, O Word.

#### **Apolytikion of the Saint in the First Tone**

Your proclamation went forth into all the earth, for it accepted your word, through which you taught the dogmas befitting God, you expounded on the nature of all that is, and you arranged the morals of society. A royal priesthood! Devout father Basil, intercede with Christ our God, to grant us His great mercy.

#### **Seasonal Kontakion in the Third Tone**

As the Master over all \* has undergone circumcision, \* so He cuts away the sins \* of humankind in His goodness. \* On this day, upon the world He bestows salvation. \* And on high \* does the Creator's hierarch Basil \* now rejoice, for he is known as \* a most divine and light-bearing mystic of Christ.

## EPISTLE READING

### St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 2:8-12

**Prokeimenon. Mode 1.**

**Psalm 48.3,1**

**My mouth shall speak wisdom and the meditation of my heart shall bring forth understanding.**

**Verse: Hear this all you nations.**

**BRETHREN**, see to it that no one makes a prey of you by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fulness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fulness of life in him, who is the head of all rule and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of flesh in the circumcision of Christ; and you were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead.

# GOSPEL READING

## The Gospel according to Luke 2:20-21, 40-52

At that time, the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb. And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him. Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the feast of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom; and when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, but supposing him to be in the company they went a day's journey, and they sought him among their kinsfolk and acquaintances; and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking him. After three days, they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions; and all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. And when they saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been looking for you anxiously." And he said to them, "How is it that you sought me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" And they did not understand the saying which he spoke to them. And he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man.

**I believe and confess, Lord, that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the living God, who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the first. I also believe that this is truly Your pure Body and that this is truly Your precious Blood. Therefore, I pray to You, have mercy upon me, and forgive my transgressions, voluntary and involuntary, in word and deed, known and unknown. **How shall I, who am unworthy, enter into the splendor of Your saints? If I dare to enter into the bridal chamber, my clothing will accuse me, since it is not a wedding garment; and being bound up, I shall be cast out by the angels. In Your love, Lord, cleanse my soul and save me.**

**Loving Master, Lord Jesus Christ, my God, let not these holy Gifts be to my condemnation because of my unworthiness, but for the cleansing and sanctification of soul and body and the pledge of the future life and kingdom. It is good for me to cling to God and to place in Him the hope of my salvation.**

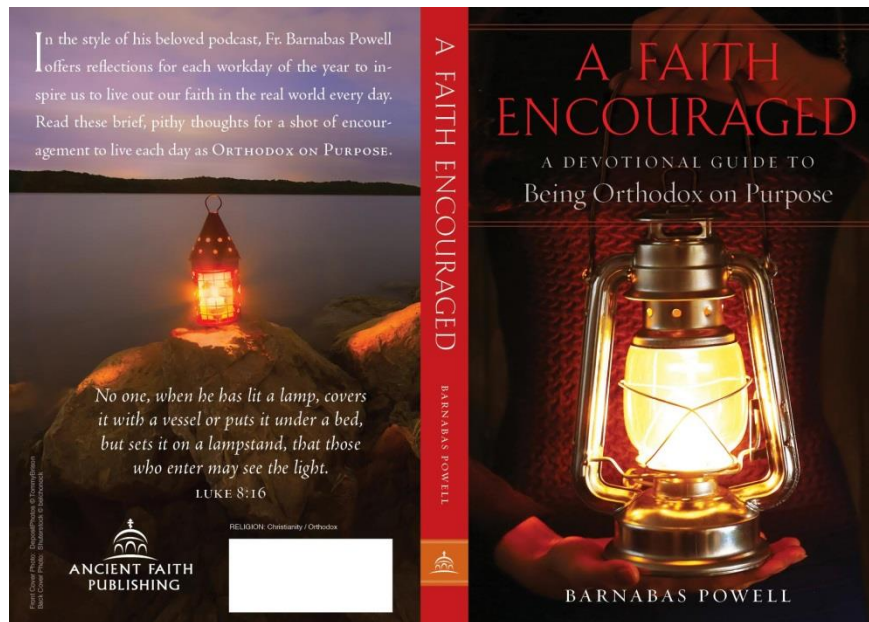
